WASHINGTON, D.C. - March 13, 2017 – The Blockchain Trust Accelerator (BTA), the leading global organization charged with developing Blockchain pilot projects for global good, announced today that its newest Blockchain pilot project will be a partnership with TechSoup, the leading online platform connecting validated nonprofits to in-kind technology and philanthropic resources at scale. The pilot project will use Blockchain technology to strengthen TechSoup's global validation services, as well as using Blockchain-based smart contracts to create new opportunities for social impact for the thousands of civil society organizations and philanthropic actors who use TechSoup's information platforms.

TechSoup operates the world's leading registry of verified civil society organizations. The platform is critical to the thousands of donors, socially responsible programs, and social benefit organizations that rely on its architecture to help match philanthropic resources with critical community needs in countries around the world. Maintaining the security, integrity and efficiency of the registry is critical to TechSoup and its partners. The registry's global scope of more than 850,000 organizations, as well as the reality that social benefit organizations are often targeted for political reasons, present real challenges. Blockchain technology will bring unprecedented levels of security and transparency to the system, safeguarding data, ensuring

accountable access to information, and enabling philanthropic resources to solve tough problems as efficiently as possible. Once the system is complete, many of the world's leading foundations and NGOs will be relying on Blockchain technology to help advance their work.

The news of this new pilot project is being announced at the <u>BTA's first-ever panel at South by Southwest (SxSW)</u>, one of the largest technology, music and film festivals in the world. Jamie Smith of The Bitfury Group, Tomicah Tillemann of New America and Dan Swislow of the National Democratic Institute (NDI) will be presenting on March 13, 2017 at SxSW Interactive from 5 - 6 p.m. on the goals of the BTA, as well as the progress made in the BTA's pilot project in the Republic of Georgia and details regarding this second pilot project with TechSoup.

About the BTA/TechSoup/Bitfury Project:

The goal of the BTA is to harness Blockchain technology to build solutions to social impact and governance challenges. Working together with a broad range of institutions, organizations and companies, BTA generates pilot projects that deliver positive social impact along with insights into how Blockchain can enhance accountability, efficiency and transparency. The Accelerator's new pilot with TechSoup will focus on integrating Blockchain and smart contract technology into TechSoup's proprietary Cooperative Technology Platform (CTP) to help TechSoup, donors and organizations streamline their data management processes and internal governance. In this use case, Blockchain technology will address administrative burdens, reduce costs, and supplement philanthropic due diligence for all partnering organizations.

The pilot project will also explore using Blockchain technology as a validation/notary service. Many organizations that TechSoup serves could benefit from an extra layer of validation, as they often offer key services and benefits without local or regional government support. A Blockchain-based system that validates the KPIs of these organizations could enable a global standard of validation for TechSoup and its donors that transcends political boundaries.

"When we launched the Blockchain Trust Accelerator, we knew that this initiative would provide a way to deploy Blockchain-based solutions to critical social and governance problems," said Val Vavilov, CEO and founder of The Bitfury Group. "We are honored to be partnering with TechSoup to use Blockchain technology to help strengthen their existing data platforms, as well as to provide an additional avenue for TechSoup and its donors to verify and support the world-changing work being undertaken by their partnering organizations."
